It was a hot and sunny weekend in the Thousand Islands as the Antique Boat Museum once again hosted what is recognized to be one of the premiere Antique and Classic Boat Shows in North America.

A core group of outboard collectors led by Scott Smith and Fran Secor presented a display of quality restored antique and classic outboards. There was a wide variety of wood and fiberglass outboard boats and motors displayed on land and in the water.

On hand to judge the outboards was noted vintage outboard author and historian, Peter Hunn. Two of our MLAOC Members came away with top Awards. Stephen Fox from Ottawa won the Outboard Motor Craftsmanship Award for his 1930 Lockwood Ace. Port Perry's Wayne Robinson won the Best Restored Classic Outboard Boat and Motor Award for his 1956 AristoCraft "SeaFlash" with Mercury Mark 55.

The Antique Boat Museum at Clayton is a world class facility. If you are interested in vintage watercraft of any type from sail boats to race boats..... from canoes and kayaks to cabin cruisers and commuters...you will find them all well represented here.
